



Welcome to the National Memorial Arboretum

The National Memorial Arboretum is the Nation's year-round place to remember, a special place that honours those who have served and continue to serve our Nation. People from all walks of life are represented, with memorials dedicated to the Armed Forces, Emergency Services and civilian organisations.

Founded by Commander David Childs CBE on a reclaimed mineral extraction site gifted by Redland Aggregates, now Tarmac, the Arboretum has flourished from a muddy open field to a beautiful growing landscape. Over 400 memorials, 25,000 trees and an abundance of wildlife now call the Arboretum home and our team work year-round to ensure we continue to celebrate lives lived and remember lives lost.

The Arboretum welcomes over 300,000 visitors each year. Alongside a daily programme of free talks, exhibitions and activities, we deliver an annual calendar of events including Armed Forces Weekend, Remembrance Sunday and Illuminated Arboretum.

With so much to explore, the Arboretum has something to offer groups of all interests. Peaceful woodlands, colourful gardens, riverside walks and fascinating stories are all waiting to be discovered.

Act of Remembrance

The Daily Act of Remembrance includes a short service and Two Minute Silence. This takes place in the Millennium Chapel at 10.50am every day. FREE

Landscapes of Life

At the heart of the Remembrance Centre is Landscapes of Life a permanent exhibition which gives an introduction to the concept of Remembrance and why it is an important human need spanning thousands of years. **FREE**

Temporary Exhibitions

Millennium Chapel of Peace and Forgiveness

The Chapel welcomes people of all faiths and none and aims to provide a quiet space where everyone will feel comfortable. It is the only place in the country where the Act of Remembrance is observed every day. The Act, consisting of the Last Post, a Silence and the Reveille starts at 10.50am. FREE

Far East Prisoners of War Memorial Building (FEPOW)

A short walk from the Remembrance Centre, the FEPOW building features a permanent exhibition established by the Children (and Families) of the Far East Prisoners of War. The memorial roll found here, contains the name and rank of all British servicemen taken prisoner during the conflict in the Far East. and tells the story of their treatment and the thousands who died as a result. **FREE**


External Talks

The GPO Memorial

During the First and Second World Wars, the work of the GPO (General Post Office) was vital to the everyday life of the nation. Letters to those serving on the Front Lines and in return, those to families at home, provided comfort and boosted morale. The GPO was also pivotal in the development of computers, used to crack the Enigma Code.

The memorial commemorates the 12.830 men and women of the GPO (General Post Office) who died in the First and Second World Wars. Designed by sculptor and artist Peter Naylor, glass panels depict photographs of postal and communication workers from the time.

Gloucestershire Regiment Memorial

Dedicated in 2024 by HRH, The Duke of Gloucester, the Gloucestershire Regiment Memorial commemorates the Regiment's 300 years' of service to our Nation. The former regiment, founded in 1694 was awarded more battle-honours than any other county regiment in the British Army.



The Pity of War

Dedicated in June 2024, the Pity of War is a national memorial for the unknown. nameless and voiceless civilians affected by war and conflict.

The memorial depicts the badge worn by the squadron, intentionally angled towards the Armed Forces Memorial so that the badge shadow bows in salute. Alongside the memorial is a tail unit from a British 1000lb bomb, set in a position that many operators would have approached knowing the danger buried beneath.







Ride to the Wall 4 October 2025

Ride to the Wall sees thousands of motorcyclists come together to remember the names engraved on the walls of the Armed Forces Memorial. During the day, a Service of Remembrance takes place at the Armed Forces Memorial. FREE[†]

A final balance request will be sent which includes information on how to pay. Final balances should be paid prior to your arrival. Numbers cannot be decreased once we have received your final balance.

On arrival

- Our friendly car parking team will direct your coach driver to our drop and go bays.
- Coaches will be met by a member of our team who will provide you with your Welcome Pack which will contain your itinerary, any tickets, restaurant vouchers, and a map
- Your coach driver will be directed to park in our coach parking area.
- A hot meal voucher will be included for all coach and minibus drivers to use in our Restaurant.

How to find us

By car: From the A38 at Alrewas there are brown signs to the National Memorial Arboretum. Follow the A513 towards Tamworth for about half a mile. Take the first exit at the roundabout and follow the road to the National Memorial Arboretum car park. Pay and display charges apply for cars and motorcycles.

Free pre-booked coach parking is available. For Sat Nav/GPS devices please enter DE13 7AR.

By Train: We are a short car journey away from Lichfield City and Lichfield Trent Valley railway stations (5-6 miles), Burton upon Trent (8 miles) and Tamworth (8 miles). Taxi services operate.

By Bus: A seven-day bus service operated by Diamond, runs from Tamworth Rail Station.
