

Keeping you safe during your visit at the National Memorial Arboretum

This document is a **guide only** and should accompany a **full risk assessment completed by the school/learning group.** We ask that the learning groups risk assessment be presented to Arboretum staff on arrival along with a full register of participants and staff in case of a fire. A register template can be found at the bottom of this document. All registration documents will be destroyed at the end of your visit.

The management of risk of your group is the group leader's responsibility. Where we have suggested learning group actions below these are *recommendations only* and a member of staff completing their own risk assessment should think about risks and hazards carefully, considering the needs of their group.
